

#### Rescue convoy

Terex Chiangjiang, the Chinese joint venture crane manufacturer, has sent a convoy of 105 new cranes to help with earthquake rescue efforts in the region.

The Terex company is the only crane maker located in the affected Sichuan province, with its production plant in Luzhou some 300 km south of the quake's epicentre. The cranes left the plant in an impressive convoy towards the stricken area. Luzhou certainly felt the quake - 8.3 on the Richter scale - however there was no serious damage was done to the plant itself.

#### **HSE prosecutes .....eventually**

After years of waiting, the UK's Health & Safety Executive has finally decided to prosecute W.D.Bennetts Plant & Services and Eurolift (Tower cranes) for the tower crane accident at Durrington High School in Worthing in February 2005. The charges relate to claimed breaches to sections of the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 and the Construction (Health, Safety and Welfare) Regulations 1996.

The accident involved one tower crane which collapsed hitting a second crane and killing two tower crane erectors. A third man, the driver of one of the cranes, suffered serious head injuries after falling from the cab. The cranes were being dismantled at the time.

#### Mine's bigger than yours!

The battle for the highest truck mounted aerial work platform is hotting up driven by wind turbine work. Finnish manufacturer Bronto is working on a larger, 104 metre version of its 101 metre working height S101 HLA. When

launched in mid 2009 it will retake the title of the world's highest reaching aerial lift. The first unit has already been sold for wind turbine maintenance work.

However, Italian platform manufacturer Socage has also confirmed that it is to produce a 100 plus metre truck platform which should be completed at the end of next year. According to Angelo Pansera, Socage managing director, the platform will definitely have a maximum working height of more than 100 metres but there is the possibility that the final working height may be as high as 105 metres. The first unit is being built for an Italian customer for wind turbine work and a further two orders have also been received.

Bronto is also working on a new 78 metre S78 XDT straight telescopic boom lift that when launched be the highest ever built - eight metres higher than the current tallest unit. The first unit is scheduled for delivery in the spring of 2009.





#### **Another New York collapse**

A Kodiak luffing tower crane working on the corner of first Avenue and East 91st street collapsed in New York City killing two construction workers and damaging a number of buildings. Another construction worker was also critically injured as well as a passing pedestrian who received minor injuries.

The crane - owned by JF Lomma/New York Crane Service - was not lifting anything at the time and was luffing its jib to maximum elevation to slew round to lift another load when a large bang was heard as a weld in the slew bearing support structure apparently failed, causing the superstructure to fall backwards off the tower.

The superstructure crashed into the building across the street, wiping out the penthouse and then striking and seriously damaging several apartments below.

JF Lomma/New York Crane Service is also the owner of the Favelle Favco crane that killed seven New Yorkers in mid March. The Kodiak crane is said to be at least 24 years old.

Investigations by the Federal Occupational Safety and Health



Administration have revealed that the weld that failed was part of a replacement bearing assembly made in China for New York Crane Service. Investigators are unsure if the welding in China was at fault or if the weld had been adversely affected when the part was welded into the turntable assembly by Brady Marine, a welding company in Elizabeth New Jersey. The Chinese part was made to repair the turntable which had been damaged on another New York building site a year ago.

#### New York crane inspector arrested

James Delayo, New York's chief inspector for Cranes and Derricks has been arrested and charged with receiving bribes from crane operators and crane companies, falsifying business records and tampering with public records.

The arrest is a result of the District Attorney's investigation into construction site incidents in Manhattan for the period of 2002 to 2007 and is not connected to this year's crane accidents.

Delayo is responsible for crane operator examinations, both written and practical, the supervision of other crane inspectors and annual crane inspections.

New York's Department of Buildings has since issued stop-work orders on the 14 cranes operating in the city that are owned by Long Island-based Nu-Way Cranes. The company has been linked to the bribery scandal involving Delayo.

#### **Order**, order...



Liebherr has launched the MTC78000, a massive 78,000 tonne/metre offshore slewing crane and already has four orders.

The massive crane, which can handle 1,600 tonnes at up to 35 metres radius is designed for mounting on large barges or similar vessels. The first two units will be mounted on jack-up barges for erecting offshore wind farms with five megawatt class turbines.

Fitted with an 87 metre boom giving a lift height of 106 metres above deck and 120 metres above sea level the crane can handle 500 tonnes with a 74 metres maximum radius

The two other cranes that have been ordered so far will be used as heavy lift cranes for working on existing offshore platforms. The MTC 78000 design and production involved all of Liebherr's maritime crane divisions with final assembly destined for the company's facility in Rostock, Germany.

behind Lavendon.

Riwal, the Dutch-based aerial lift and telehandler rental company has made two acquisitions significantly extending its market coverage in Europe.

The first and largest is the long rumoured purchase of a 70 percent stake in Spanish aerial lift and telehandler rental company, Clem. With a fleet of around 2,000 units, 12 locations and around 25 million revenues the Clem acquisition gives Riwal a significant position in the Spanish market. Clem emerged out of a company founded in 1945 by Jose Noguera and will be managed on a day to day basis by general manager Javier Gómez González. Jose Jaime Noguera, the current

owner, who will retain 30 percent



#### Its all too Easi

Easi UpLifts/Height for Hire - the Irish based aerial lift, crane and telehandler rental company - has ventured further into continental Europe by acquiring a controlling interest in Strojné Centrum Slovakia, (SCS) the Kosice based aerial lift rental company. SCS runs a fleet of around 100 aerial lifts mainly JLG and Genie - as well as a few telehandlers.

In April Easi UpLifts opened its first operation in continental

Europe with a sales base in Holland headed up by Ronan MacLennan who has been responsible for the company's used equipment business.

Height for Hire is Ireland's largest aerial lift rental company and has expanded into the UK in recent years where it is currently implementing a major expansion programme. As part of this programme it has placed a large order with Manitou, for telehandlers which includes the first MRT30 in the UK.

#### **Profits leap at Tadano**

Tadano the world's fourth largest mobile crane manufacturer revealed revenues up by more than 20 percent to ¥174 billion (\$1.67 billion) and profits up by more than 40 percent to ¥17.96 billion (\$174 million) in its financial results for the 12 months to the end of March 2008.

After a slow start strong replacement demand for its RT cranes helped increase sales in its domestic market by 10.7 percent to ¥92.8 billion (\$898). Overseas demand increased in North America, Europe and the Middle East with export sales rising by almost 34 percent to ¥81,6 billion (\$790 million). This took export sales to a record 46.8 percent of total revenues.

#### Disneyland spectacular

Potain launched several new models at an event at Disneyland, Paris earlier this month with the highlight being the unveiling its new Igo 42, a replacement for the HD40.

The crane has a maximum capacity of four tonnes and is available with a 36 metre or 32 metre jib and can lift a maximum of 1.1 or 1.4 tonnes at its jib end.

Also shown was the six tonne capacity, 45 metre maximum jib length Igo T 85 which replaces the GTMR346; the Igo MC 13 which has a maximum lift of 1.8 tonnes and maximum jib of 22 metres and completing the new line-up an MDT 268 top-slewing tower crane - the largest in the MDT range with a




maximum capacity of 12 tonnes and a maximum jib length of 65 metres. This model replaces the MDT192 and complements the recently launched MDT218.

MCG also announced a new Manitowoc Crane Care centre in Nantes and the opening of its brand new factory in Saris, Slovakia.

## Up the 'Pool

Two articulated boom lifts from AFI-Uplift have helped create a large-scale planter as part of Liverpool's European Capital of Culture programme. The planter will form an eye-catching centre piece of a new garden being created on derelict land in the middle of a housing estate.



The two 13.7 metre platform height Haulotte HA16PX booms with nine metres outreach and rented from AFI's Liverpool depot, helped attach expanded mesh to the outside of the steel sculpture to encourage plants growing inside to spill out over the outside of the structure.

## Take five

Sennebogen UK distributor EH Hassell has sold an 80 tonne Sennebogen 683 HD telescopic crawler crane fitted with twin winches,



a 42ft full power boom and a high lift operator cab to Morgan Est, the infrastructure services company. The company is the first contractor in the UK to take delivery of a 683. The unit was displayed at SED where the official hand over ceremony took place. Morgan Est will be using the new crane at sites across the country and expects it to increase productivity and safety. It has also purchased five Sennebogen lattice boom crawler cranes including a 650HD, two 680HD and two 6100HD - the first of this type in the UK.

#### Coal mine collapse

A 1,100 tonne Lampson Transilift crane working at the Black Thunder Mine in north east Wyoming, USA, collapsed at the end of May injuring three people, including an operator and blocking one of the USA's busiest railway lines.

The accident happened as the crane was moving a 250 tonne, 70 metre long section of conveyor tube which passes over the railway lines. A section of the tubing blocked the main line tracks, which carries around a third of the nation's coal.

The crane was working on the construction of a load-out silo, which is used to move coal into freight cars. Lampson is quoted in the local press as saying that the ground shifted under the crane, causing the accident.

#### ESTA 2008 awards

ESTA - the European crane and heavy haulage association - announced its 2008 awards at a users night in Amsterdam. The winner of the award for a lift involving cranes up to 100 tonnes was Mediaco of France for the installation of a tower crane in the old town centre of Draguignan in southern France.

The winner of the award for lifts involving cranes of over 100 tonnes was BMS of Denmark for the installation of a 193 tonne foot bridge in Copenhagen.

ESTA's Innovation Award 2008 went to Peinemann, the Rotterdam-based crane and access company for its new bundle lifter which offers an alternative to web slings, while this year's Excellence Award went to Terex Demag's CC8800-1 Twin crawler crane. The first unit has been shipped to Al Jaber in preparation for its first lift.

And finally, the Personality of the Year 2008 went to Leo Spierings, founder of Spierings Kranen - the Dutch manufacturer of truck-mounted self erecting tower cranes.

#### JCB trio

JCB has announced that chief operating officer Matthew Taylor has taken over from long serving chief executive John Patterson from June. Patterson, 58 will continue as a main board director as well as retaining his role as chairman and CEO of JCB Inc., its USA

business. Taylor, 48, joined JCB in April 2006 as managing director of JCB Sales and in January last year became group chief operating officer.

The company has also announced its numbers for 2007, revenues were up 30 percent to a record £2.25 billion while pre-tax profits rose 25 percent to £187 million - the best in its 62 year history. The company says that it built over 72,000 machines last year- up from



55,000 in 2006 - a figure that it claims makes it the world's third largest manufacturer in terms of the number of units built.

JCB also announced a joint venture partnership with BNP Paribas Lease Group which will offer a full range of leasing and other retail finance programmes to JCB customers, as well as providing flexible facilities to support dealer inventory and demonstration equipment requirements.

Bromsgrove-based GT Access has ordered 150 scissor lifts from UpRight, the order valued at around £1.4 million, is the largest from a UK rental company since the manufacturer was acquired by Tanfield in 2006. The bulk of the order wich was placed through UpRight Powered Access Sales UK is made up of X32 and MX19 electric scissor lifts, along with some X26, X26Narrow, X27/X33RT's and SL30 Speed Levels.

GT Access managing director Jonathan Till, says that the new models will replace up to 130 older UpRight machines, expanding his existing fleet to about 350 units. Most machines have been delivered over the past few weeks.

"We are as busy as we have ever been, probably because we concentrate on the industrial rather than building sector of the market," said Till.



# Tower block

When construction company Skanska and Legoland Windsor recently got together to build the world's highest tower from Lego bricks, it called in Nationwide Access to provide an aerial lift to gain access as the structure grew in height. The tower took four days to build using nearly 500,000 bricks and reached a record-breaking 95.99ft (29 metres) in height.

Before selecting the lift, Nationwide carried out a site survey to identify the ideal machine for the delicate outdoor building work. The application called for a rigid platform, large outreach and enough space for an operator and the Lego builders, so a 37 metre - 22 metre outreach Ruthmann T37B truck mounted unit was chosen. With a





platform size of 2.30 x 1.05 x 1.20 metres there was also the space required to hold a large quantity of Lego bricks and the Legoland staff.

#### New training centre

A-Plant, one of the UK's largest rental companies, has opened a new National Customer & Technical Training Centre in Nottingham. #### Speedy expands

Speedy Hire, the UK's largest equipment rental company has reported a 39 percent jump in full year revenues to the end of March at £465 million, while pre tax profits rose 18.8 percent to £48.1 million.

Revenues were boosted by a number of acquisitions, including Hewden's tool hire business and Waterford Hire

in Ireland last summer, but they had a negative effect on margins.

The company has also acquired the temporary accommodation business of Carillion Asset Management for £11 million in cash plus £1.5 million of debt and signed a five year Strategic Partnering Agreement with Carillion, one of the UK's largest contractors.



#### Job done

There was some debate as to which was the best of the two rebuilds - either way, both were a credit to the two youngsters. #### **New Cat telehandlers**

Caterpillar has launched three new telehandlers, the TH406, TH407 and TH414, all three have a maximum lift capacity of 3,700kgs. The 406 has a lift height of 6.1 metres and forward reach of 3.1 metres. The 407 a lift height of 7.3 metres and forward reach of 3.7 metres while the 414 offers 13.7 metres height with up to 9.2 metres forward reach.

Cat claims that the load-sensing, flow-sharing hydraulics deliver high digging and lift forces and allow all

boom functions to be operated simultaneously and proportionally. The Z-bar linkage on the TH406 and TH407 delivers strong breakout forces when using a bucket.

A 74.5 kW (100 hp) Cat C4.4 turbo charged engine is standard on all machines with a more powerful 93.1 kW (125 hp) C4.4 engine with ACERTTM technology available on the 406 and 407. Both engines are certified to Stage IIIA (Tier III) emission regulations.

### Alive and well thanks

A man working five storeys up, is alive today thanks to his harness after his 135ft boom lift tipped over at Melbourne University, Australia. It is still unclear what caused the machine to tip however, as the lift went over its boom struck the boom of a crane working alongside and came to rest on the top of the crane's counterweight, while the basket ended upside down in the branches of a tree.

The 27 year-old operator would have been dashed to the ground with the full force of the fall, accelerated by the catapult effect when the boom hit the crane, but thankfully he was wearing a full body harness and short lanyard and was left suspended three or four metres above the ground.



Colleagues quickly freed him from his harness and he was in the first aid room being treated for minor scratches by the time the paramedics arrived.

#### United to take a \$14 million hit

United Rentals, the world's largest rental company has filed documents stating that it will book a \$14 million charge in the second guarter 2008. The money is to cover the expected cost of the Securities and Exchange Commission investigation concerning a number of sale and leaseback transactions aimed to inflate the company's results during the period 2000 to 2002.

Two senior executives were dismissed and face personal fines and possibly imprisonment. Michael Nolan the former chief financial officer, has already pleaded guilty to filing false documents, while former chief executive John Milne has been indicted for securities fraud and insider trading.




