ALLMI Issues Updated Guidance on Avoiding Bridge Strikes

With nearly 2,000 incidents occurring every year in the UK alone, the issue of "Bridge Bashing" is one which affects many aspects of the transport industry. The use of lorry loaders is no exception to this, with the failure to stow a loader crane correctly for travel having potentially fatal consequences.

As well as the potential to cause death or serious injury, the cost of a bridge strike can run into hundreds of thousands of pounds when inspections and train delays are taken into account. Add to this the hidden costs associated with this kind of accident - increased insurance premiums, personal injury claims, the cost of management time spent on dealing with the aftermath, disgruntled customers resulting from the late or non-delivery of goods - and it's easy to see why it can prove ruinous for any business. For these reasons, the training of operators to correctly stow their equipment for travel and the promotion of the legal requirement for height warning devices, are among ALLMI's top priorities.

ALLMI technical director, Alan Johnson, said: "We have recently provided members with an updated version of ALLMI Guidance Note 008, which covers the subject in some detail. We've also supplied guidance documents issued by Network Rail, the quality of which is excellent and so we're encouraging members to use them in conjunction with the ALLMI Toolbox Talk template in order to refresh the awareness, not just of drivers, but also those involved in route planning and transport management". He continues "ALLMI fully endorses the Network Rail Bridge Strike Avoidance campaign and we would encourage all those in the industry to further educate themselves on this subject." visit www.networkrail.co.uk/bridgestrikes
