ALLMI technical manager and chairman of the TSC, Keith Silvester said: "It was a highly productive meeting, with important topics discussed. This included the current development of two new Guidance Notes covering front stabilisers and product familiarisation, which we look forward to publishing in the coming months."

MANAGER COURSES – ARE YOU COMPLYING WITH PUWER 9.2?

ALLMI's range of manager courses continues to be well regarded and respected, with companies throughout the lorry loader industry recognising the value of strengthening their compliance with PUWER 9.2.

PUWER 9.2 "Every employer shall ensure that any of his employees who supervises or manages the use of work equipment has received adequate training for purposes of health and safety, including training in the methods which may be adopted when using the work equipment, any risks which such use may entail and precautions to be taken."

ALLMI training and project officer, Jon Kenyon, said: "Our manager courses are delivered over a single day and are abbreviated, attendance based versions (no assessments) of our standard training programmes, covering the same key subject areas and, in some cases, also including a practical element. As well as helping companies comply with PUWER 9.2, the courses provide managers with a greater understanding of the technical, legislative and operational issues for which they are responsible, and this enhanced knowledge often then leads to improved practices being implemented throughout the business."
